CALL TO ORDER

Emergency special meeting called to order by Mayor Johnson.

Ron Nalley stated that new information has been released regarding debris removal and monitoring. Debris removal and debris monitoring will be 100% FEMA reimbursable if DOT assumes both contracts. Crowder Gulf and Tetra Tech will both be subcontractors under DOT. The City must enter into an Interlocal Agreement with Franklin County for this to happen, and debris removal and debris monitoring contracts must be assigned to DOT.

Attorney Floyd stated DOT will handle all debris removal and State of Florida will take all legal and financial responsibility.

Mr. Nalley stated this doesn't replace the existing debris removal and debris monitoring contracts. It just reassigns the contracts to DOT.

Commissioner Anita Grove made a motion to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with Franklin County and reassign debris removal contract and debris monitoring contract to DOT so the City can get reimbursed 100% from FEMA for debris removal. Commissioner Brenda Ash seconded the motion carried 5-0.

Discussion held concerning City wide cleanup efforts, downtown Trick or Treat event, utility bills, and storm related damage assessments.

ADJOURN THE MEETING

With no further business, Commissioner Jimmy Elliott made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Brenda Ash seconded and the motion carried 5-0.
