The City reserves the right to reject any or all proposals and to waive technical errors if, in the City's judgement, the best interest of the City will thereby be promoted. All bidders must be fully capable, both financially and in experience, of performing and completing the work in a satisfactory manner within the required time frames. Bidder shall have a minimum of three (3) years' experience with a minimum of three (3) equivalent projects.

Non-resident bidders must accompany any written bid documents with a written opinion of an attorney-at-law licensed to practice law in such non-resident bidder's state of domicile, as to the preferences, if any or none, granted by the law of that state to its own business entities whose principal places of business are in that state in the letting of any or all public contracts.
